### **WHAT'S HAPPENING WITH THE EAGLES NOW?**

*Another Nest and Camera Move at Norfolk Botanical Garden*

Norfolk, VA (December 9, 2008) - The resident bald eagles at Norfolk Botanical Garden (NBG) are on the move again.

The eagles don't seem interested in using the nest that was built earlier this year, where so much turmoil ensued this past nesting season \*. Instead, they are starting to rebuild their *original* nest that fell apart in 2007.

This means a move for the camera and infrared light which makes it possible for the public to watch the Eagle Cam's live streaming video 24 hours a day.

**WHAT:** Arborists with Nuckols Tree Care Service will climb trees to move the Eagle Cam camera and infrared light.

**WHEN:** Wednesday, December 10, 2008  
9 AM – 1 PM

**WHERE:** Norfolk Botanical Garden

**WHY:** Eagles are *rebuilding their old nest*. Moving the camera will mean the public will be able to view the entire process of building a nest when the Eagle Cam goes live.

**WHO:** Experts will be on hand to explain why the nest move may be taking place and to discuss the dramatic events of the past nesting season and to discuss the status of the NBG eaglet taken from the nest in May.
