**NORFOLK BOTANICAL GARDEN EAGLE CAM IS LIVE FOR 2009**

Norfolk, VA--The Norfolk Botanical Garden Eagle Cam is live for the 2009 nesting season! This collaborative project of the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, Norfolk Botanical Garden and WVEC.com allows viewers an intimate look into the lives of a pair of bald eagles nesting at the Norfolk Botanical Garden with live streaming video. The pair has returned to their original nest within the garden after building and using a new nest last year. The eagles have been active at the nest site and we'll look for the first egg in the near future.

The Eagle Cam provides 24-hour viewing of the nest activities with night vision capability. VDGIF biologists maintain a blog that explains the activity at the nest and describes the natural history of these impressive birds. WVEC will post daily slide shows from the nest, allowing viewers to keep up with what's happening. Visitors to Norfolk Botanical Garden can see the eagles (from a distance of course) at strategic viewing sites that include mounted binoculars and telescopes.
