


- The Spring 2025 Plant Sale is online only. Garden members will have exclusive shopping beginning at 10 AM on Friday, April 25TH

BRILLIANTINA™ Abelia — has stunning semi-evergreen foliage that is a combination of yellow, green, and orange - all held on red stems. Like other selections, the summer blooming white flowers are fragrant and attract hummingbirds and insect pollinators. Unlike other selections, BRILLIANTINA™ has a compact, well behaved habit with minimal "stray hairs" in constant need of pruning. It prefers full to part sun in moist well drained soil; deer resistant; heat and humidity tolerant. \$25.00

'Pumpkin' Texas Firecracker — (a.k.a Hummingbird Plant) is an upright, deciduous shrub with an informal, spreading appearance. It is native to south-central Texas and northern Mexico. The slender, brittle stems have attractive, peeling bark. Soft orange, tubular flowers (1-1.5" long) appear in abundance during bloom periods, most often from spring to late summer. Extremely attractive to hummingbirds, butterflies, and other pollinators. Deer tend to avoid this plant. Prefers full sun in well drained soil, very drought tolerant. Plant a piece of NBG in your own garden - this offering comes from our collections. \$15.00

PUGSTER PINKER® has large clusters of fragrant pink flowers with small orange eyes that bloom from early summer through fall - without deadheading! Like all butterfly bushes, it is a butterfly magnet. Prefers full sun in moist well drained soil; heat and drought tolerant once established; deer resistant. \$25.00

Callicarpa americana American Beautyberry

American Beautyberry — is one of our best Southeastern and Coastal Virginia native shrubs. Small lavender pink flowers bloom in summer attracting butterflies and other insect pollinators. However, the real show is in the early fall when bright purple berries adorn the branches providing a feast for the eyes and a tasty treat for birds and other wildlife. If you are adventurous, the fruit can be eaten fresh, or processed into jelly. The foliage has mosquito repelling properties, and it turns a nice soft yellow in the fall. Prefers full sun in moist soil where it will produce the most fruit, but it will also grow in light shade. Once established it can tolerate both occasional drought and wet soil. Blooms and fruits on new growth, so occasional winter pruning is

Pearl Glam® Callicarpa — is showy starting in spring, with dark purple foliage from the get-go. Late summer brings white flowers which later yield violetpurple berries by the hundreds. Upright habit makes this a space-saver compared to more conventional beautyberry varieties. An unusual foliage color, and a different habit make this a new twist on beautyberry. Prefers full sun in moist well drained soil; deer resistant. \$25.00

Sweetshrub (a.k.a. Carolina Sllspice) — is an old-fashioned favorite, native to Coastal Virginia. It is a dense, rounded deciduous shrub with a suckering habit, and grows 6-9' (less frequently to 12') tall with an equal or slightly greater spread. The unusual, 2" maroon flowers bloom in late spring and have a fruity aroma. Flowers give way to brownish, urn-shaped fruits (seed capsules) which mature in fall and persist throughout the winter. Lustrous, dark green leaves to 6" long turn golden yellow in fall. Leaves are aromatic when bruised. Another common name is strawberry bush, in reference to the fragrant blooms which have been described as combining hints of pineapple, strawberry and banana. Prefers full to partial sun in evenly moist well drained soil, once established it is tolerant of occasional droughts and floods, deer resistant. \$30.00

Ceanothus americanus

New Jersey Tea — is a deciduous shrub that is native to eastern and central North America, including Coastal Virginia. It is low growing with a rounded crown and typically wider than tall. In early summer it is covered with fragrant clusters of creamy white flowers that are highly attractive to butterflies, bees, and hummingbirds. The ripe seeds will attract songbirds. The foliage was used to make tea traditionally. It grows best in well-drained sandy loam or rocky soils in full sun to partial shade. Its deep root system makes it very drought tolerant once established, and good for use in erosion control on slopes. **\$10.00**

Cephalanthus occidentalis

Common Buttonbush — is a handsome shrub native to Coastal Virginia, and it is well suited to wet soils. Beneficial native pollinators, honeybees, and hummingbirds are attracted to the flowers, and ducks and other water birds consume the seeds. It has glossy dark green foliage and showy white spring flowers with a very unique structure. The round button-like fruits appear in winter to keep this plant interesting year-round. Sun to partial shade in moist to wet soils. Tolerant of occasional salt flooding, but prefers fresh water.

SUGAR SHACK® Buttonbush — is a downsized version of our Coastal Virginia native that still has those unusual, showy, fragrant white flowers, colorful red fruit, and glossy foliage. The flowers attract hummingbirds, butterflies, bees, and other beneficial pollinators, while the ripe seeds attract songbirds and other wildlife. It prefers full sun to partial shade in moist to wet soil; deer resistant. A fantastic choice for gardeners with problematic soggy soil! \$20.00

DOUBLE TAKE 'Orange Storm' has double, vibrant orange flowers that will attract a few pollinators. Flowering quince blooms in late winter to early spring, but DOUBLE TAKE® selections may have some rebloom in the summer and fall. Prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soil, drought tolerant once established.

EL NINO® Desert Orchid — This exciting plant is a very unique intergeneric hybrid between desert willow (*Chilopsis linearis*) and catalpa (*Catalpa* sp.), combining the drought and heat tolerance with showy flowers. Indeed, the fragrant blooms look like clusters of pinky purple orchids and begin blooming in late spring to early summer, continuing sporadically through the growing season. EL NINO® can be treated as a large shrub or a small tree, and it prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soil; drought tolerant and deer resistant. **\$25.00**

Summersweet — is a Coastal Virginia native that attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and loads of insect pollinators. The glossy dark green leaves set off the pure white flowers in early summer. Later, birds and other wildlife will enjoy the ripe seeds. Plant it near the deck or patio to enjoy the sweet scent. In fall the foliage turns a handsome golden yellow. It will grow in full sun to near near-deep shade; tolerant of wet soil, deer, and some salt. When this species is in full bloom, it becomes the pollinating insect version of

VANILLA SPICE® Summersweet — is a wonderful cultivar of one of the most beneficial Coastal Virginia natives. It attracts butterflies, hummingbirds, and loads of insect pollinators — a real magnet! The attractive, glossy dark green leaves set off the pure white summer blooms. The flowers of VANILLA SPICE® are larger than other *Clethra* varieties, and they are wonderfully fragrant as well! Birds will enjoy the ripe seeds. The foliage turns an attractive golden yellow in fall. Plant it near the deck or patio to enjoy the sweet scent in early summer. Tolerant of full sun to near-deep shade in moist to wet soils, deer resistant and salt tolerant. **\$20.00**

This particularly selection also has a more compact habit than the species, making it well suited to smaller gardens. The plant prefers full to part sun in moist well drained soil. Once established, it is deer and drought resistant. \$20.00

WINECRAFT BLACK® Smokebush — is a smaller scale smokebush, offering plenty of color over a long season. The deciduous foliage emerges a deep purple in spring, changing to near-black in the heat of summer, then blaze orange and red in fall. The smoke-like, red-pink flower panicles that give this shrub its nickname arrive in early summer attracting butterflies. Requires full sun in moist well drained soil, deer and drought resistant. \$20.00

CHARDONNAY PEARLS® Deutzia — Pearl-like white buds open to white flowers in spring. Chartreuse-gold foliage persists from spring through early fall adding multi-season interest. Its compact size is perfect for smaller spaces. Does best in part to full sun in moist well drained soil; deer resistant and drought tolerant once established. \$20.00

SHOW OFF® Forsythia — is an improvement on old fashioned forsythia. It has increased flower power with blossoms covering each bare stem from the ground to top in late winter. Cotton Rose (a.k.a. Confederate Rose) — is indeed related to cotton and other members of the hibiscus family, but is a rose in resemblance only. A large shrub or small tree, in late summer the 3-6" wide, usually double blooms open white and age to dark pink giving the entire plant a multicolored effect. Hummingbirds, butterflies, and bees will be attracted to the flowers. It needs full sun in moist soil; tolerant of occasionally we soil. Plant a piece of NBG in your own garden - this offering comes from our collections. \$12.00



Lavender flowers contrast with deep green foliage, and the blooms will attract pollinators. Unlike older varieties of Rose of Sharon, this hybrid has a very low seed set, so it will not seed around your garden. Prefers full sun in moist well drained soil; adaptable, deer resistant. \$20.00




PUFFERFISH® Panicle Hydrangea — has unusually large, fluffy flowers covering most of the plant, nearly obscuring the foliage! The flowers emerge white and age to a pale green, but a few sprigs of white will emerge later at the tip of the blossoms. PUFFERFISH® has a compact habit, and strong stems to hold up all those blooms. Like other panicle hydrangeas, this one blooms in mid-summer and the flowers will attract pollinators. Panicle hydrangeas prefer full sun to partial shade, moist well drained soil; salt tolerant. \$25.00



New blooms emerge to give you a festive mix of pink, green, white, and red blooms all on the same plant. Like other panicle hydrangeas, this one blooms in mid-summer and the flowers will attract pollinators. Panicle hydrangeas prefer full sun to partial shade, moist well drained soil; salt tolerant. \$25.00

FIRE LIGHT TIDBIT® Panicle Hydrangea — is a great choice for gardeners with only a little space to work with. On a very dwarf plant, the blooms emerge lime green, then age to white, and finally take on pink tones. Bonus – this is one of the few panicle hydrangea varieties with decent fall foliage color, turning yellow and orange. Like other panicle hydrangeas, this one blooms in mid-summer and the flowers will attract pollinators. Panicle hydrangeas prefer full sun to partial shade, moist well drained soil; salt tolerant. **\$25.00**

'Southern Gentleman' Winterberry Holly — is a male cultivar of a Coastal Virginia native holly that is needed to pollinate certain female winterberry hollies, including 'Cacapon', 'Shaver', 'Sparkleberry', 'Sunset', 'Winter Red', and 'Winter Gold'. Deciduous foliage turns golden yellow in the fall, and while the spring flowers are not that showy, they do attract pollinators. Prefers full sun to partial shade in moist soil, tolerant of wet soil, and once established they are also drought tolerant. \$40.00

Henry's Garnet Virginia Sweetspire — is a favorite cultivar of the Coastal Virginia native *Itea*. Its fragrant white flowers are typically larger than the species, but like the species, it blooms from late spring to early summer attracting hummingbirds, butterflies, and other pollinators. Plus, the ripe seeds attract songbirds and other wildlife. 'Henry's Garnet' typically has more colorful fall foliage than the species turning outstanding shades of orange, scarlet and deep purple lasting into early winter. All *Itea* are very adaptable, being able to grow in sun or shade, in wet or dry soil, plus they are deer resistant. They truly are one of our best native shrubs! \$30.00


Peonies

Peonies are an old-fashioned favorite whose large, often fragrant, late-spring flowers are quite showy, and cherished by flower arrangers. They can sometimes be tricky to grow in the South, so gardeners need to give them what they want - full sun and rich, moist, well drained soil. Herbaceous peonies (those that die to the ground every year) tend to begin dormancy in late summer, earlier than most perennials, so don't worry if yours look rough by August. Tree peonies maintain above-ground stems all year, even after the foliage drops. All peonies are typically deer resistant, but deer don't always read plant labels.

Wooly Dutchman's Pipe — is a woody, twining vine native to the southern and central United States. It is covered in large, heart-shaped leaves, parts of which are covered in wooly hairs. This vine is dense and relatively fast growing providing welcome shade to patios and porches in the summer, but being deciduous, it will allow warm sun through during the winter. It has oddly shaped flowers that bloom in mid to late spring that are yellow-green with purple to brown accents. They need an arbor or some other structure to grow on, and are a welcome addition to butterfly gardens as they are a host plant for pipevine swallowtail butterflies.
