

Instructor **HIGHLIGHT**

Dana Lusher, Nature's Nanny Wildlife Rehabber

Dana Lusher is a local wildlife rehabber, and has been teaching at Norfolk Botanical Garden since 2015. We were able to catch up with her and ask a few questions about how she got started as a wildlife rehabber.

How long have you operated Nature's Nanny Wildlife Rehabilitation?

NNWR was founded in October of 2014 to help fund the work that we had been doing since 2011. There is no funding for wildlife rehabilitation and as a 501(c)3 organization we would be eligible to apply for grants and donations to help feed and care for our patients.

What inspired you to become a wildlife rehabilitator?

I was a mental health counselor for 20+ years. I had a 4 day per week schedule and would spend my off day photographing wildlife at the Garden. I was there more than home. On my days off and after work I could be found strolling the paths. In fact. This is where I met my first wild eagle, owl, frog, otter, etc. When the program I had loved for so many years went down, I chose a change of career and became a pet sitter. While building my business I had plenty of time to pursue nature and photography and it was during this pursuit that I met my first wildlife rehabilitator. One of the baby owls I had been photographing came down and needed help. I followed the baby's recovery and watching how the rehabber affected that baby's life, I wanted to help! She finally allowed me to come volunteer and rehab, for me, was a match made in heaven!

What's your favorite part about your job?

To call rehabbing a job has so many inaccurate implications. It is a mission, a passion, a drive. But not a job. A job you typically go home from and receive pay and maybe even accrue vacation leave. As a rehabber you are faced with a 24/7 involvement in wildlife that is such a blessing. You find yourself constantly evaluating, researching and reaching out for support. It is a huge job—with an a never ending

stream of patients who need you! Very early on in rehabbing I discovered that a large number of our patients came in due to accidental human interaction. I realized that I could keep solving one incident at a time forever and never reduce this impact, or I could work on the source of these injuries. I decided to start an education program to introduce birds to people and work towards teaching others to live with wildlife without accidentally hurting them. This has been an amazing adventure! I love the opportunity and getting to see the effect on those who are able to meet them!

If you could give a tip for people to takeaway to help protect wildlife what would it be?

Realize that wild animals are so much more than eating and reproducing! They have homes, families, friends and personalities! They play, they grieve, they work together in their environment. If people can appreciate those things about wildlife, then likely they will live their lives as good neighbors to our wildlife and intentionally help them rather than accidentally harm them!! If you see a sick or injured animal you can call Eastern Virginia Wildlife rescue at 757-255-8710 or myself at 757-714-5093 and get them real help in real time.


