- The sale will be open to the public beginning at 10 AM on Saturday, April 25TH and available until 4 PM. The sale will reopen at 10 AM Sunday, April 26TH and close at 4 PM.
- The plant sale is included with regular Garden admission
- There are a limited number of carts available but you are welcome to bring your own
- We can hold your purchases while you bring your car around for loading, or if you want to go explore the Garden after making your purchase.

Terms of Sale:

Please note—this catalog is not a firm list of all plants that will be available. Some of them may not be ready at the time of the sale and will be withheld. Additionally, we may add plants for sale at the last minute.

While there is no expressed guarantee on any of the plants, staff from our Horticulture Department can always be reached at askaplantquestion@nbgs.org to help you select the best plants for your situation and later they can offer advice if the plants are not thriving.

Frequently Asked Questions

Question: Where is the plant sale located?

Answer: The 2026 Spring Plant Sale is located in-person at the Garden this year. You will need to come onsite to purchase your plants.

Question: Can I purchase a Garden Membership before the sale begins?

Answer: Yes, you are able to purchase a membership before and during the sale. Members receive access a full day prior to the public sale and will receive 10% off their order. [Click here to become a Member!](#)

Question: Do I have to pay Garden admission to shop or explore the plant sale?

Answer: Yes, the plant sale is included with Garden Admission. If you have a membership you do not need to pay for Garden Admission - your membership will get you into the Garden for the plant sale.

Question: Can Reciprocal Garden Members through the American Public Garden Association (APGA) attend the plant sale and receive a discount?

Answer: Reciprocal members through the APGA receive general admission to the **Garden** during all three days of the plant sale. However, on **Friday**, only Norfolk Botanical Garden members may enter the plant sale and receive a 10% discount on all plant purchases. On **Saturday** and **Sunday**, reciprocal Garden Members through APGA may shop the plant sale, but will not receive a discount.

Abelia grandiflora 'Kaleidoscope'



'Kaleidoscope' Glossy Abelia — is a variegated, evergreen shrub that brings new colors with each season! The leaves emerge as bright green and yellow in the spring and warm up to red and orange shades in the summer, and intensifying in the winter. Expect the soft pink blooms of late spring to blossom into perfumed white flowers in the summer that attract insect pollinators. It prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soil; once established it is drought tolerant and deer resistant. **\$30.00, \$40.00**

Tres Amigos® Glossy Abelia — The foliage on this multicolored evergreen shrub begins spring with green, cream, pink, and yellow foliage. As summer progresses it becomes primarily cream, green, and pink. Small, fragrant, white flowers bloom sporadically all summer attracting hummingbirds and insect pollinators. Prunes easily. It prefers full to part sun in moist well drained soil; deer resistant; heat and humidity tolerant. **\$25.00**

Aronia arbutifolia 'Brilliantissima'



'Brilliantissima' Red Chokeberry — is a selection of a Coastal Virginia native shrub, with multiple seasons of interest. In late spring, it has fragrant, half-inch white to light pink flowers resembling wild roses. Butterflies and other insect pollinators enjoy the flowers' nectar. Summer foliage is a lustrous dark green and is followed by spectacular red fall foliage which holds on well into the winter. Bright red fruit ripens in late summer and can persist into winter. They are bitter, but birds and mammals will eat them. They are also very high in antioxidants and can be juiced or made into jam. 'Brilliantissima' differs from the species with its superior, more colorful foliage; larger berries; and more compact habit. It prefers full to partial sun, though best fruit production will be in full sun. Prefers moist well drained soil, but they are very tolerant of wet soils. **\$45.00**

LOW SCAPE MOUND® Black Chokeberry — This cultivar of a native shrub is a tough, tolerant, tidy little mound of glossy green foliage. In spring, it's covered in hundreds of dainty white flowers, and in autumn, the leaves turn brilliant red to contrast with dark purple-black fruit. Although the fruit is very bitter, it is edible and very high in anti-oxidants, though the birds will not care. The unique low-growing, mound-shaped habit of this new variety makes it perfect for mass planting as a ground cover or edging plant. It prefers full sun to partial shade in moist well drained soil; salt and drought tolerant. **\$30.00**

Like others, it will attract butterflies and other insect pollinators, but without being invasive like older selections. Prefers full sun in moist well drained soil; drought tolerant once established; deer resistant. **\$25.00**

American Beautyberry



American Beautyberry — is one of our best Southeastern and Coastal Virginia native shrubs. Small lavender pink flowers bloom in summer attracting butterflies and other insect pollinators. However, the real show is in the early fall when bright purple berries adorn the branches providing a feast for the eyes and a tasty treat for birds and other wildlife. If you are adventurous, the fruit can be eaten fresh, or processed into jelly. The foliage has mosquito repelling properties, and it turns a nice soft yellow in the fall. Prefers full sun in moist soil where it will produce the most fruit, but it will also grow in light shade. Once established it can tolerate both occasional drought and wet soil. Blooms and fruits on new growth, so occasional winter pruning is recommended. **\$30.00**

'Aphrodite' Sweetshrub — is a new and improved, long-blooming selection with deep red, magnolia-like flowers in late spring above glossy green, waxy foliage. 'Aphrodite' is a hybrid between our North American native *Calycanthus* and an Asian species, and like other sweetshrubs, the flowers can be fragrant, though not always reliably so. It is a Proven Winner Selection with larger, showier flowers. Prefers full sun to partial shade in moist well drained soil; heat and humidity tolerant. **\$25.00**

Calycanthus floridus



Sweetshrub (a.k.a. Carolina Allspice) — is an old-fashioned favorite, native to Coastal Virginia. It is a dense, rounded deciduous shrub with a suckering habit, and grows 6-9' (less frequently to 12') tall with an equal or slightly greater spread. The unusual, 2" maroon flowers bloom in late spring and have a fruity aroma. Flowers give way to brownish, urn-shaped fruits (seed capsules) which mature in fall and persist throughout the winter. Lustrous, dark green leaves to 6" long turn golden yellow in fall. Leaves are aromatic when bruised. Another common name is strawberry bush, in reference to the fragrant blooms which have been described as combining hints of pineapple, strawberry and banana. Prefers full to partial sun in evenly moist well drained soil, once established it is tolerant of occasional droughts and floods, deer resistant. **\$30.00**

SUGAR SHACK® Buttonbush — is a downsized version of our Coastal Virginia native that still has those unusual, showy, fragrant white flowers, colorful red fruit, and glossy foliage. The flowers attract hummingbirds, butterflies, bees, and other beneficial pollinators, while the ripe seeds attract songbirds and other wildlife. It prefers full sun to partial shade in moist to wet soil; deer resistant. A fantastic choice for gardeners with problematic soggy soil! **\$35.00**

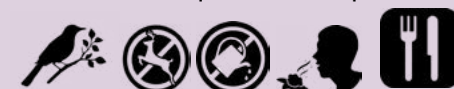

'Texas Scarlet' Flowering Quince — blooms in late winter with bright red blooms on otherwise bare branches, which can be harvested earlier and forced to bloom indoors. In late summer to early fall the apple-like, aromatic fruit ripens and can be used for jams and jellies, birds like them too. This selection is more compact than others. Prefers full sun to part shade in moist well drained soil, drought tolerant and deer resistant. **\$45.00**

In late summer to early fall the apple-like, aromatic fruit ripens and can be used for jams and jellies, birds like them too. Prefers full sun to part shade in moist well drained soil, drought tolerant and deer resistant. **\$45.00**

Chitalpa 'NCX1' EL NINO®

EL NINO® Desert Orchid — This exciting plant is a very unique intergeneric hybrid between desert willow (*Chilopsis linearis*) and catalpa (*Catalpa* sp.), combining the drought and heat tolerance with showy flowers. Indeed, the fragrant blooms look like clusters of pinky purple orchids and begin blooming in late spring to early summer, continuing sporadically through the growing season. EL NINO® can be treated as a large shrub or a small tree, and it prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soil; drought tolerant and deer resistant. **\$25.00, \$35.00**

The attractive, glossy dark green leaves set off the pure white summer blooms, and like other summersweet, the flowers of SUGARTINA® are wonderfully fragrant. Birds will enjoy the ripe seeds. The foliage turns an attractive golden yellow in fall. Plant it near the deck or patio to enjoy the sweet scent in early summer. The deciduous foliage emerges a deep purple in spring, changing to near-black in the heat of summer, then blaze orange and red in fall. The smoke-like, red-pink flower panicles that give this shrub its nickname arrive in early summer attracting butterflies. Requires full sun in moist well drained soil, deer and drought resistant. **\$25.00**

WINECRAFT GOLD® Smokebush — offers several seasons of interest. The new foliage emerges in spring with a handsome orange color, turning to gold, and eventually maturing to chartreuse. The ivory white flowers bloom in summer and age to pink, all the while resembling a puff of smoke. Butterflies appreciate the flowers. This particularly selection also has a more compact habit than the species, making it well suited to smaller gardens. The plant prefers full to part sun in moist well drained soil. Once established, it is deer and drought resistant. **\$25.00**

YUKI KABUKI™ Deutzia — is a relatively new introduction with beautiful two-toned pink blooms in spring. Dark green foliage takes on red, yellow, and purple tones in the fall. Its bushy mounded habit will require little, if any pruning. Part to full sun in moist well drained soil; deer and drought resistant once established. **\$25.00**

'Spring Glory' Forsythia — One of the classic signs of spring, this plant will bring bright yellow flowers covering bare branches in March. It prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soil, easy to grow and tolerant of pollution, urban conditions, poor soil and salt. **\$40.00, \$50.00**

Requires full or partial sun in moist well drained soil, resistant to deer and very adaptable. **\$25.00**

Fothergilla major 'Mount Airy'



'Mt. Airy' Fothergilla — is a cultivar of a multi-season plant native to the mountains of the Southeast. In the spring, delicate honey-scented, white, bottlebrush flowers bloom attracting butterflies and other insect pollinators. Blue-green foliage emerges afterwards, and in the fall, it turns a rich mix of orange, red, and yellow. Prefers full sun to partial shade in moist well drained soil. 'Jojo' Joe Pye Weed— A new introduction of a very showy Coastal Virginia native, this cultivar has a smaller habit making it more manageable than its very large relatives. The flowers are also fuller and showier and attract a number of pollinators, but being sterile, the blooms last longer from July to the first freeze, without seeding around your garden. Unfortunately, this makes them less valuable to birds, so plant something else for our feathered friends. Prefers full sun in moist soil; tolerant of wet soils, poor soils, and clay. **\$12.00**

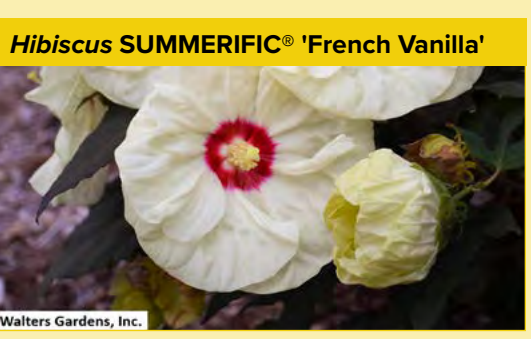

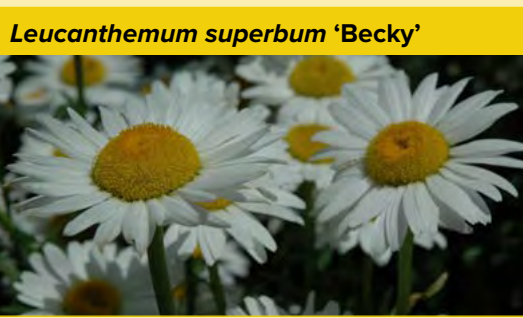

Peonies

Peonies are an old-fashioned favorite whose large, often fragrant, late-spring flowers are quite showy, and cherished by flower arrangers. They can sometimes be tricky to grow in the South, so gardeners need to give them what they want – full sun and rich, moist, well drained soil. Herbaceous peonies (those that die to the ground every year) tend to begin dormancy in late summer, earlier than most perennials, so don't worry if yours look rough by August. Tree peonies maintain above-ground stems all year, even after the foliage drops. All peonies are typically deer resistant, but deer don't always read plant labels.

Narrow-leafed Mountain Mint — is a widespread, East Coast native, including Coastal Virginia. The slender foliage is very aromatic, and the clusters of white flowers are one of the showiest of mountain mint species. Like other members of the genus, it is one of the best native perennials for attracting beneficial insect species to your garden. In good conditions this plant will easily naturalize. 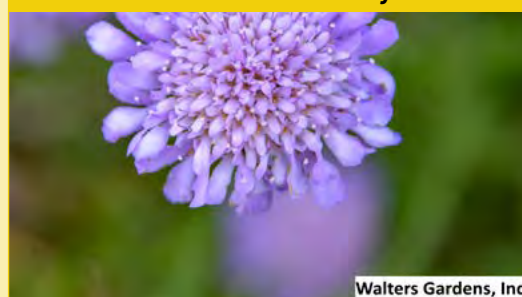

Downy Skullcap — is a North American native that is also occurs in a few Virginia locations. In mid-summer clusters of showy purple flowers rise above bushy green foliage attracting butterflies and other insect pollinators. Prefers full to partial sun in moist well drained soil, but it is adaptable to varying soils and can even thrive in heavy clay; drought tolerant and deer resistant. **\$12.00**

Prairie Dock — If you are an unashamed fan of big plants, then this North American native might be just right for you. Most of the foliage stays at the base of the plant, but the flower stalk can rise 8-10'. In mid to late summer the stalks are topped with bright yellow, sunflower-like blooms that attract numerous pollinators, and birds will enjoy the ripe seeds. Well adapted to the prairie, the taproot on this plant can extend 14' deep! It needs full sun in moist well drained soil; drought tolerant once established. **\$12.00**

Bromeliad — This species is native to Brazil, but has become a popular and widely used landscape plant in tropical areas around the world. Although the flowers stalk is dramatic in yellow and red, and it makes a long-lasting cut flower, it is primarily grown for its bold strap-like foliage. Each blade can reach 2-3' long, and in full sun it will take on a striking golden orange color. This species creates lots of pups that can be easily divided from the mother plant. In less light the foliage will be green. Indoors, it will need bright light in evenly moist, but well drained soil. In late spring it can be brought outdoors and transitioned to full sun.
